MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION & ANALYSIS

FOR THE SIX MONTHS ENDED JUNE 30, 2023 AND 2022

GENERAL

This management's discussion and analysis ("MD&A") of the financial position and results of operations is as at August 29, 2023 and should be read in conjunction with the condensed interim financial statements of Daura Capital Corp. (the "Company" or "Daura") for the six months ended June 30, 2023 and 2022 and the related notes thereto. Those financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS") issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ("IASB"). All dollar amounts included therein and in the following management's discussion and analysis are in Canadian dollars except where noted. These documents and other information relevant to the Company's activities are available for viewing on SEDAR+ at www.sedarplus.ca.

COMPANY OVERVIEW

The Company was incorporated under the Business Corporations Act of British Columbia on March 29, 2018. The Company is classified as a Capital Pool Company ("CPC") as defined in Policy 2.4 of the TSX Venture Exchange ("TSX-V" or the "Exchange"). The Company's principal business is to identify, evaluate and acquire assets, properties or businesses which would constitute a qualifying transaction in accordance with Policy 2.4 of the Exchange. The Company's common shares are listed on the TSX-V under the symbol "DUR". The Company's head office is located at 704 - 595 Howe Street, Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada.

In March 2020, the World Health Organization declared coronavirus COVID-19 a global pandemic. This contagious disease outbreak, which has continued to spread, and any related adverse public health developments, has adversely affected workforces, economies, and financial markets globally, potentially leading to an economic downturn. It is not possible for the Company to predict the duration or magnitude of the adverse results of the outbreak and its effects on the Company's business or ability to raise funds. Therefore, there is uncertainty that may cast doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern.

HIGHLIGHT

During the six months ended June 30, 2023, the Company returned all subscriptions received in advance in connection to the concurrent financing related to the Company's proposed Qualifying Transaction with Estrella Gold SAC ("Estrella").

RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

Three months ended June 30, 2023

The Company recorded a loss of \$11,352 for the three months ended June 30, 2023, compared to the loss of \$1,067 for the comparative period. The loss was primarily attributable to professional fees paid or accrued during the period and there was interest income accrued in the comparative period.

Six months ended June 30, 2023

The Company recorded a loss of \$6,252 for the six months ended June 30, 2023, compared to the loss of \$4,915 for the comparative period. The loss was primarily attributable to a general and administrative expenses, partially offset by recovery on fees previously paid and recognized in the profit or loss.

FINANCIAL CONDITION, LIQUIDITY AND CAPITAL RESOURCES

As at June 30, 2023, the Company had working capital deficit of \$416,294 (December 31, 2022 - \$198,676), which was primarily comprised of cash of \$1,363, accounts payable and accrued liabilities of \$316,457, and a non-interest-bearing note payable of \$101,200 due on or before June 30, 2023 (should the Company complete its contemplated Qualifying Transaction and concurrent financing on or before June 30, 2023, the loan shall be converted into 506,000 units having the same terms as those issued in connection with the concurrent financing). The term of this loan was extended subsequently. The Company had no long-term debt.

During the six months ended June 30, 2023, cash decreased by \$210,040, primarily from cash used in financing activities.

Operating activities

During the six months ended June 30, 2023, net cash provided by operating activities amounted to \$1,326, which included an increase of accounts payable and accrued liabilities of \$7,578.

Financing activities

During the six months ended June 30, 2023, net cash used in financing activities was \$211,366, which related to the return of subscriptions received in advance in connection to the concurrent financing related to the Company's proposed Qualifying Transaction with Estrella.

FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS, RISKS AND CAPITAL MANAGEMENT

The Company does not utilize complex financial instruments in hedging metal price, foreign exchange, or interest exposure. Any hedging activity requires approval of the Company's Board of Directors. The Company will not hold or issue derivative instruments for speculation or trading purposes. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

For the six months ended June 30, 2023 and 2022, there was no compensation to management personnel.

For the six months ended June 30, 2023, the Company paid or accrued \$Nil (2022 - \$Nil) to Seabord Services Corp. ("Seabord"). Seabord provides the following services to the Company: A Chief Financial Officer ("CFO"), a Corporate Secretary, accounting and administration staff, office space, and any related work to the IPO and Qualifying Transaction of the Company. The CFO and Corporate Secretary are employees of Seabord and are not paid directly by the Company.

As at June 30, 2023, the Company had \$59,985 (December 31, 2022 - \$28,985) due to an officer of the Company related to advances and expense reimbursements, and \$63,000 (December 31, 2022 - \$63,000) due to Seabord which have been included in accounts payable and accrued liabilities.

EVENT AFTER REPORTING DATE

Subsequent to June 30, 2023, the Company received an additional non-interest-bearing advance \$2,229 from a related party.

OFF-BALANCE SHEET ARRANGEMENTS

The Company has no off-balance sheet arrangements.

The Company has successfully completed its IPO. Subsequent to the completion of its IPO, the Company is not permitted to carry on any other business other than the identification and evaluation of assets or business to complete a Qualifying Transaction. There can be no assurance the Company will successfully identify an assets or businesses to complete a Qualifying Transaction or have the necessary financial resources to complete a Qualifying Transaction. There can be no assurance that the Company will be able to successfully obtain the necessary financing in the future on terms acceptable to the Company or at all.
